A. There is mathematically 1 chance out of 5 with 60 zeros behind it for the following prophecies to be fulfilled. Keep in mind that even scholars who do not believe the Bible will agree that these prophecies were written before the event(s) they predict. There are about 2500 prophecies in the Bible. 2000 of these have been fulfilled literally. The other 500 pertain to Christ's return and the events and happenings associated with it.

PART 17: Decision Time!

We can say how awful it is that God seems so narrow-minded in providing only one way about being saved from the punishment for sin. Or, we can say how wonderful that God cared enough to make a way to escape His wrath by trusting Christ!
